BREAKWATER REHABILITATION PROJECT

"THE CREEK" JACKFISH LAKE, SASKATCHEWAN

Project Details

"The Creek" as its affectionately known, opens at the breakwater located at the mouth of Lehman Creek (west side of the creek). This section empties into Jackfish Lake. The Resort Village of Cochin spearheaded this inititaive in 2015.

It was first constructed in the late 30's or early 40's as a means of preventing wave action and ice movement on Jackfish Lake from closing off the creek mouth with sand and silt. Prior to that, the mouth of the creek was like a delta with small, non-navigable rivulets. **Etransfers accepted. Receipt provided.**

Over the decades since then, attempts have been made to maintain and refurbish the breakwater, with limited success. It has now deteriorated to the point where it is at risk of total failure which, when it happens, the creek mouth will return to its delta existence.

The health of the two (2) lakes and the creek will be seriously affected. Navigation through the creek will be limited to shallow draft water crafts and water levels on Murray Lake, will likely rise and those on Jackfish Lake will likely fall. There is also a fear that fish migration will be negatively affected.

The cost to repair/rebuild/refurbish the breakwater will, in total, be \$1.8 million.
